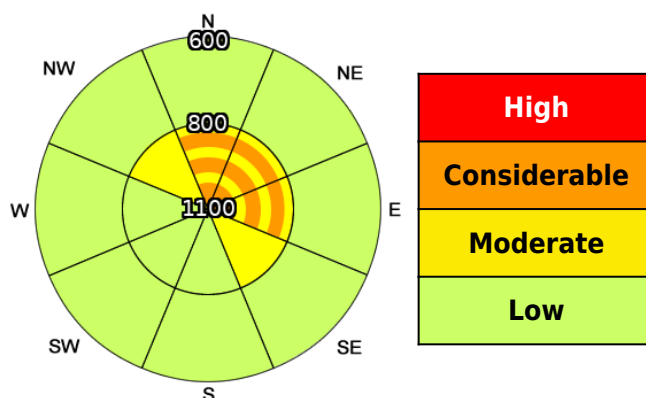

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised areas of moderately bonded windslab will persist on steep, sheltered North to East aspects above 800m. Some new snow instabilities will develop as small quantities of soft slab begin to build and cross-load onto steep North to East gully flanks and exits late in the day. New weak cornice development on recent lee slopes. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Remaining dry and cold for much of the period with a few light snow showers later in the day. Winds will be initially light West-South-Westerly increasing to strong North -Westerly with the arrival of snow showers at all levels.

Comments

A bright and clear day to start before the return of showery conditions on the tops and some deep drifts away from main trails.
