

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New accumulations of unstable windslab will build on mainly Easterly to Southerly aspects mainly above 900 metres with some localised deposits forming on North-East and Southerly aspects due to cross loading. Some moderately stable accumulations may form in steep wind sheltered places below this level on the same aspects but above 600 metres. Elsewhere stability is generally good with wind scoured bare areas and firm snow-ice. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Snowfall is expected overnight above 500 metres. Winds will be very strong North-North-Westerly lessening slightly in the day becoming North-Westerly. Freezing level 600 metres overnight lowering to 500 metres in the day.
