

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Areas of unstable windslab will persist on North-East through South-East to South aspects mainly above 750 metres, with steep sheltered locations such as coire rims, gully exits, and crag aprons most affected. North and South-West aspects will also be affected due to cross-loading. Additionally, fresh windslab will form on West aspects as a result of snow redistribution. Elsewhere, the snowpack will be firm and stable with some snow-ice. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



**Forecast Weather Influences**

A period of light wintry showers overnight will die out by early morning to give a fine sunny day. The moderate to fresh North-Westerly wind will veer Easterly by daybreak. The freezing level will steady around 450 metres during the day.
