

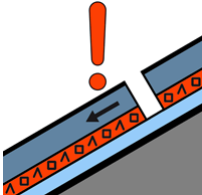

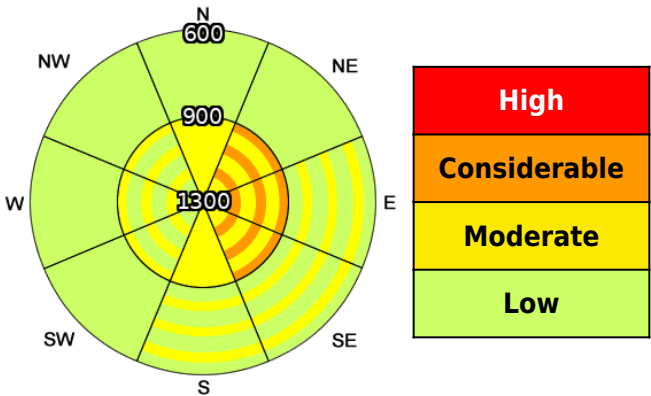
Wind Slab



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Moderate to poorly bonded Windslab will continue to build in wind sheltered places on mostly East to South-Easterly aspects above 900 metres with some localised accumulations on North, North-East and Southerly aspects due to cross loading. Below 900 metres the snowpack is generally stable in most areas, but some moderately well bonded accumulations will be present in isolated steep lee slopes on East to South aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, winds will continue strong to moderate strength West-North-Westerly veering North-Easterly during the afternoon and lessening moderate to light on the tops. Some snowfall overnight above 300 metres. Freezing level around 500 metres.
