

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Poorly bonded windslab will continue to develop on South-Westerly to North-Westerly aspects above 900 metres with corrie rims, gully exits and crag aprons being especially affected. In steep sheltered areas some localised moderately bonded windslab will remain on North through East to South-East aspects. Below 900 metres instabilities will be present within deeper accumulations in areas of steep terrain. New cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow fall at all levels overnight on strong East-South-East winds. Dry during the day with strong winds becoming moderate through the afternoon, backing East-North-Easterly. The freezing level will be around 300 metres.
