

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised unstable wind slab through redistribution of snow will build mainly on North-West to South-West aspects above 650 metres. The cold temperatures will maintain the existing snow pack instabilities on all other aspects above 650 metres. These are mostly localised due to recent cross loading on steep convex terrain such as gully tops and corrie rims. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong East-North-East winds will back North-North-East during the night and into tomorrow, becoming fresh. Very occasional light snow showers are expected. The freezing level will be around 250 metres rising to 400 meters tomorrow.
