
Avalanche Hazard Forecast - FOR PERIOD 18:00HRS Sun 14/02/2016 TO 18:00HRS Mon 15/02/2016



Hazard Level	Avalanche Probabilty
Very High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. Numerous very large, often extremely large natural avalanches can be expected.
High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. In some cases, numerous large, often very large sized natural avalanches can be expected.
Considerable	Natural and human triggered avalanches possible, in some cases large, in isolated cases very large sized natural avalanches are possible.
Moderate:	Very large sized natural avalanches are unlikely. Human triggering possible in indicated steep places.
Low	Only small and medium sized natural avalanches are possible. Human triggering possible in steep, extreme terrain.

Forecast Weather Influences

Cold conditions continuing with moderate winds easing through the period. After a few overnight snow showers it will be a dry day. The freezing level will be around 300 metres.

Forecast Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected in the snowpack. Areas of windslab will exist on many aspects above 800 metres. North-East to South-East aspects will tend to hold areas of older, moderately bonded hard slab. South to West aspects will hold less extensive patches of fresh, soft, poorly bonded windslab. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable

Observed Weather Influences

After a cold frosty night, there were a few snow showers through the day. The freezing level was around 300 metres. Moderate winds were from the North-East.

Observed Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

A complex picture with accumulations of windslab on many aspects above 800 metres. Quite extensive areas of older windslab exist on North-East to South-East aspects. Fresher soft less well bonded, but generally less extensive areas of windslab exist on South to West aspects. The avalanche hazard is Considerable.

Mountain Conditions

Observed Mountain Travel Conditions	Reasonable cover above 600 metres, hard going on foot. Clear in the morning, but was generally cloudier with poorer visibility during the afternoon. Cold winds approx 10 - 20 mph.
Comments	Currently quite a complex picture in terms of windslab distribution and stability.
