

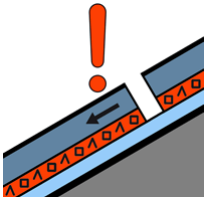

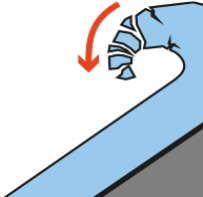

Wind Slab



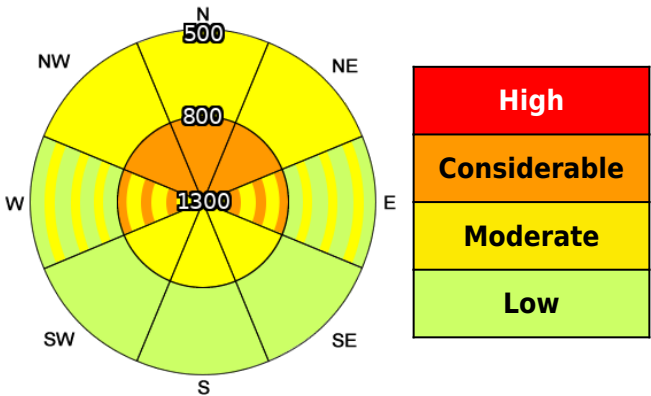

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

There will be a redistribution of snow, with new windslab quickly developing on North-West to North-East aspects above 800 metres; here especially in areas of steep and convex terrain avalanches are likely. Unstable windslab will develop on other aspects due to cross loading. Wind exposed slopes will become more eroded with older instabilities persisting in steep sheltered terrain. Cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Severe gale to storm force Southerly winds by the morning with snowfall during the day, this will turn to sleet or hail for a spell as the freezing level rises to above the summits.
