




Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab




Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Very poor stability overnight. Weakly stabilised windslab will be present on North to South aspects above 800m, with avalanches likely. Deepest accumulations will be on steep, sheltered North-East to South-East facing gullies and corrie backwalls. Large weak cornices will overhang all of these locations. Better stability on recently wind scoured areas. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers continuing overnight but becoming lighter during daylight hours. Strong Westerly winds easing and becoming North-Westerly. Staying cold but less so during the day.

Comments

Access very difficult on Sunday. Very little snow at 350m but 40cm of undrifted snow on the Coire Ardair path at 450m and deeper beyond. Very tiring trail breaking away from the path.
