



Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Poor to weekly bonded windslab will persist, and continue to build, on North-East to South-Easterly aspects above 950 metres, with isolated accumulations of unstable windslab on wind sheltered North and South aspects. Below this level stability is mostly good but with localised moderately well bonded deposits in steep wind sheltered places. Large cornices overhang all Easterly aspects. South-West to North-West aspects are mostly firm and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will be strong North-Westerly throughout the forecast period. Snow showers above 200 metres overnight, then in the afternoon at all levels. Freezing level around 300 metres.
