

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Poorly bonded snow persisting at depth and within shallow accumulations on North-East to South-Easterly aspects above 950 metres especially in steep, convex terrain. Poorly bonded windslab will begin to develop later in the afternoon around corrie rims and gully tops on North-West to North-East aspects. Stability generally good at lower levels with moderately bonded snow remaining on some steep slopes. Large unstable cornices overhang East aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

High pressure continuing; Dry throughout with light South-Easterly winds veering to the South-South-West and increasing to moderate by the end of the day. The freezing level will rise to 600 metres.
