

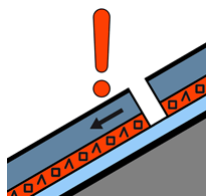

Avalanche Problems



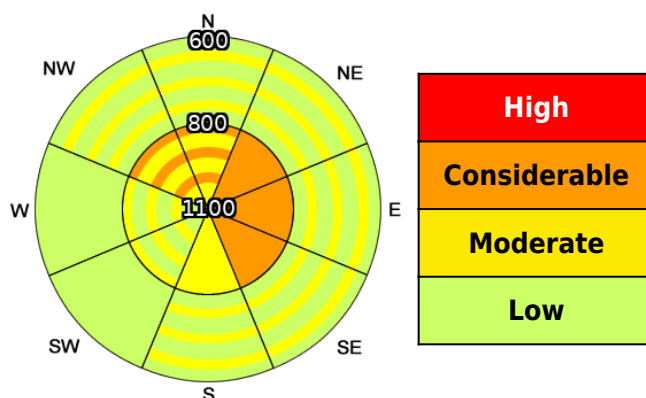
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Instabilities will remain within existing deposit of generally quite firm windslab which exists on North-East to South-East aspects above 850 metres. Through the day fresh areas of unstable windslab will be deposited on North-West to North-East aspects above 800 metres. These fresh deposits are not expected to be particularly deep or extensive. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

After a dry night some snow is expected through the day. South-South-Westerly winds will strengthen through the period. The freezing level will rise from about 500 metres to around 800 metres by the evening.

Comments

An alpine atmosphere on Creag Meagaidh today. Expect it will feel rather more Scottish tomorrow.
