

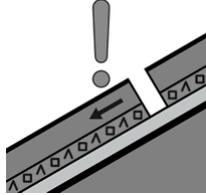

### Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 03/03/2016



Wind Slab




Persistent Weak Layers

#### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Poorly bonded windslab will continue to develop on Easterly to Southerly aspects mostly above 800 metres where avalanches are likely, with weak accumulations on some Northerly and Southerly aspects due to cross loading. Below 800 metres and above 500 metres unstable but localised accumulations will form in wind sheltered steep places on similar aspects. Wind exposed areas will be scoured and bare or icy. Cornices above Easterly aspects will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



#### Forecast Weather Influences

Persistent snowfall overnight will die out by midday. Winds will be strong North-Westerly decreasing in strength by mid afternoon, before backing South-Easterly at the end of the day. Freezing levels will be around 400 metres.
