

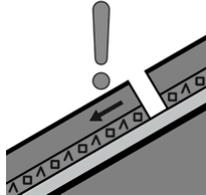

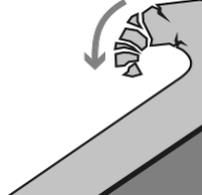

Wind Slab




Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Further accumulations of unstable windslab will form on mainly East to South aspects above 800 metres. North-East and South-West aspects will be affected with unstable deposits due to cross loading. Where wind exposed, the old snowpack will have a stable surface layer. Cornices will continue to form and be fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

The wind will be initially storm force North-Westerly easing in the early hours then backing through the day and becoming light Southerly. There will be light snow showers overnight above 500 metres. The freezing level will be around 500 metres.

Comments

Becoming drier with strengthening North-East winds.
