

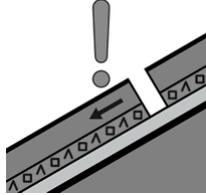



Wind Slab





##### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Some redistribution of the existing snowpack and additional snow accumulations will form unstable windslab on mainly South-East to South-Westerly aspects above 800 metres, persisting on East. Localised accumulations will be on other aspects due to cross loading. Below this level stability will generally be good but localised moderately stable snow will be present in steep wind sheltered places. Cornices on East aspects will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



##### Forecast Weather Influences

Light South-Easterly winds this evening slowly backing through the night and during the day becoming moderate strength North-North-Easterly. Precipitation will fall as snow showers overnight with increasing amounts during the day, above 300 metres. Freezing level will be around 600 metres.
