

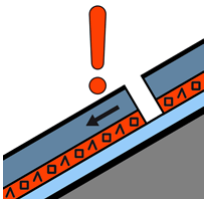

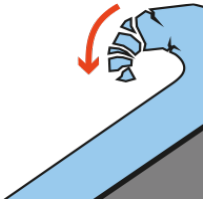
Wind Slab

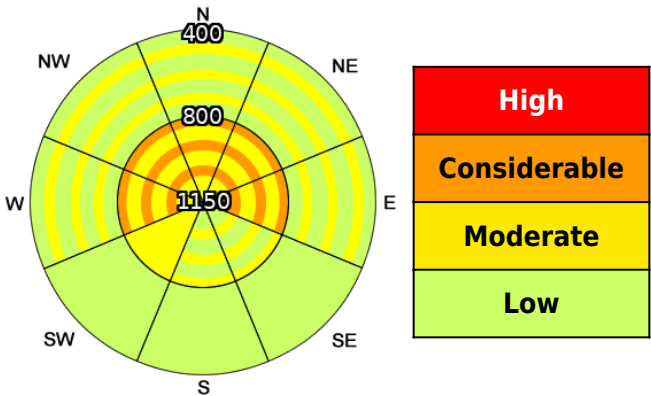

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh localised deposits of unstable windslab will form mainly on West to North aspects above 800 metres, the areas most affected being steep gully exits and scarp slopes. Unstable windslab will persist on North-East to East aspects. Where wind exposed, the old snowpack will have a stable surface layer. Cornices will be fragile and liable to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

The wind will be South-Easterly backing North-North-Easterly variable fresh to strong. There will be very light snow showers overnight above 400 metres. The freezing level will be around 500 metres.
