





Wind Slab




Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Poorly bonded windslab will continue to build on South-East to South-West aspects above 800 metres with avalanches likely mostly in areas of steep and convex terrain. Localised windslab will be on other aspects due to cross loading. Unstable windslab will form on some steep sheltered slopes below this altitude. New cornices will be fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Snowfall is expected above 200 metres throughout the forecast period. This will be heavier overnight and lighter through the day. Winds will be strong Northerly and the freezing level will fall to 400 metres.
