

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Initially some light drifting with soft poorly bonded windslab forming mostly around corrie rims and gully tops on East through South to South-West aspects above 900 metres. Sun exposed slopes will potentially be affected by surface instabilities. On all other aspects instabilities will persist in areas of steep and convex terrain. Cornices will be unstable especially on sun exposed slopes. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers will clear to leave a dry night with some sunshine through the day. Moderate North-North-Westerly winds will ease to light through the afternoon and back West-North-Westerly. The freezing level will be around 400 metres.

Foggy conditions made route finding quite tricky in steep terrain with the variable snow pack
