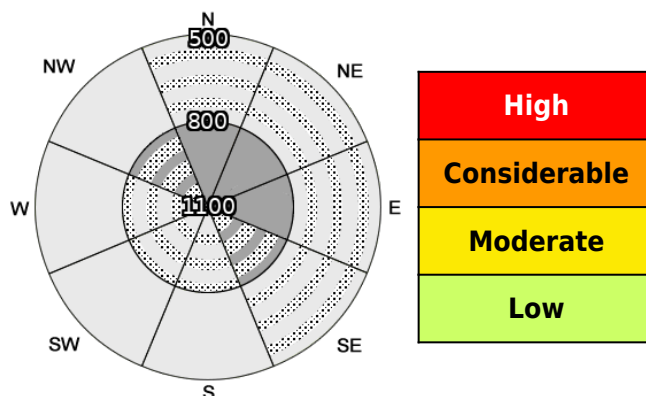

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh unstable windslab will develop with greatest accumulations on North to East aspects above 800 metres. Cross loading will also cause windslab to develop on North-West and South-East aspects. Cornices will build above North to East aspects. Slopes exposed to the wind will become scoured. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

The wind will start light becoming strong South-South-West through the night then veering West-South-West and easing slightly during the day. Initially dry with snow showers starting during the night and continuing throughout the period. Freezing level 500 metres overnight rising to 650 metres during the day.
