




Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New poorly bonded windslab will accumulate mainly on North-West through North to Easterly aspects above 800 metres from both new snowfall and the redistribution of existing lying snow. The tops of gullies and corrie rims will be most affected. Exposed ridges will remain icy. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, strong Southerly winds accompanied by snow showers with the freezing level around 400 metres. During the morning the winds will moderate, veering towards the West as the showers continue and the freezing level rises briefly to 700 metres. Colder again by the end of the forecast period.

Comments

Good build up of ice on Liathach, especially in the corries shaded from the sun.
