

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New and redistributed snow will form unstable windslab on mainly Northerly to Easterly aspects above 900 metres with corrie rims, gully exits and crag aprons most affected. North-West and South-East aspects will be affected due to cross loading. Below this level and above 600 metres localised moderately stable deposits will be confined to steep wind sheltered places on similar aspects. Elsewhere stability will generally be good. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds light South-South-Westerly overnight, strengthening in the morning to strong West-South-Westerly. Light snow showers throughout the day. Freezing level 5-600 metres, but with snow lying at lower levels overnight.

Comments

A bright and sunny day with some stabilisation of the snowpack. More snow and strong winds in the next days.
