

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Additional accumulations of poorly bonded windslab will overlie existing instabilities on mainly North to South-East aspects above 700 metres, other aspects will be affected with unstable deposits due to cross loading. The tops of gullies and corrie rims will be particularly affected. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Moderate Southerly winds during the evening will veer to the North West by morning. Overnight snow will clear by dawn leaving a predominantly dry day. Later in the afternoon the wind will back Westerly as snow showers resume. Freezing level around 400 metres overnight before rising gradually to 600 metres by the end of the forecast period.
