



Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh snow and redistribution will build unstable windslab on most aspects as the wind backs through almost a full circle. Greatest accumulations will be found on North to East aspects above 800 metres initially but localised areas of unstable windslab will be found on all aspects above 800 metres at some time during the period. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Moderate South-West wind easing and backing North-North-West overnight before becoming moderate again and backing to West during the day. Snow showers overnight dying out in the morning to give a dry afternoon. Freezing level 700 metres, dropping to 500 metres overnight, then rising to 700 metres during the day.
