

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Localised instabilities will remain on North-East to South East aspects above 700 metres. Corrie rims, crag aprons, the tops of gullies and steep convex terrain will be most affected. Slopes that have been exposed to the sun will refreeze overnight. As temperatures rise later in the day surface instabilities will develop on all aspects, especially those exposed to the sun. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

It will be dry throughout the forecast period. Light North Easterly winds overnight will become moderate during the day as they veer to the South by late afternoon. The freezing level will be around 700 metres till dawn before rising above the summits during the afternoon.
