




Avalanche Problems




Persistent Weak Layers



Cornices

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Mild conditions will affect existing localised Instabilities in the snowpack, mainly on North-West, through North-East to East aspects above 700 metres. The most affected areas will be coire backwalls, gully exits and steep summit slopes. Cornices, mainly above steep slopes on East through South to South-West aspects will become unstable. Elsewhere the snowpack will continue to consolidate. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will be mainly dry and mild throughout the forecast period. A fresh and gusty Southerly wind is expected with the freezing level well above the summits. Generally overcast and cloudy throughout.

Comments

Good underfoot conditions with firm snow in most places.
