Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will gradually moisten and loose surface releases are likely on all steep slopes. Localised instabilities will persist beneath the windslab on North-East to South-East aspects above 950 metres, with steep and convex terrain most affected. Below 950 metres although soft the snowpack will generally be stable apart from steep places where it will be moderately stable. Cornices overhanging East aspects will be liable to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

The freezing level will be well above summit levels throughout the forecast period. Winds will be light to moderate strength Southerly getting stronger as the day progresses. A mainly dry day but with some precipitation falling as sleet at summit levels around first light.

Comments

A warm spell will present a period of instability.
