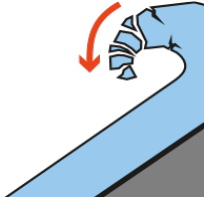

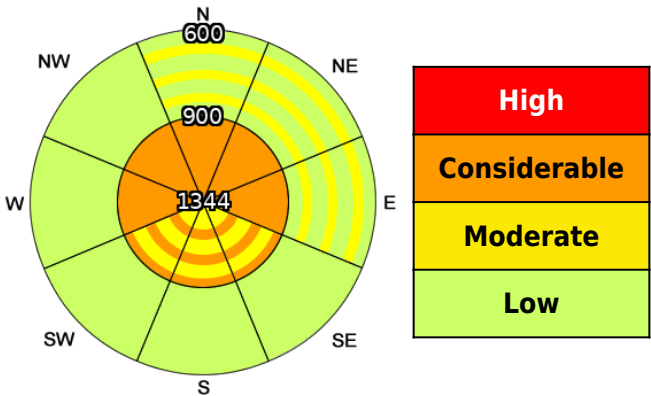

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Redistribution will cause unstable windslab to build mainly on steep West through North to North-East aspects above 900 metres. Localised instabilities will persist in the existing windslab on most aspects above 900 metres with North to East aspects most affected. As the temperature rises through the period avalanches are likely on West through North to East aspects above 900 metres. Cornice will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Moderate South-South-East winds. Freezing level around highest summits overnight then rising through the day. Becoming cloudy but mainly dry.
