




**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The existing snowpack will continue to thaw at all levels and localised deep instabilities will persist. Most affected will be steep convex slopes, the tops of gullies, coire headwalls and steep summit slopes, mainly on North through East to South-East aspects above 700 metres. Additionally, cornices will remain unstable and prone to collapse and falling ice and rocks will present a hazard on all aspects and at all levels. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Continuing mild and wet, with rain at all levels throughout the period and the freezing level will be well above the summits. A strong to gale force South-South-West wind will ease slightly by the end of the afternoon. Cloudy.

**Comments**

Evidence of falling ice and rocks. Some cornice debris observed and full depth glide cracks noted on steep South-East aspect, Fionn Beinn.
