


Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will generally be well bonded and stable in all areas although it will soften through the period with localised wet snow instabilities on North - East through South to South - West aspects above 700 metres, especially on slopes receiving direct sunlight. Remaining cornices will continue to slump potentially collapsing and affecting the slopes below. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Fresh Easterly wind will be variable remaining generally from the East, easing overnight and returning to fresh tomorrow. The freezing level will be well above the summits.

Comments

This high pressure will continue to dominate giving us a dry and settled period with clear skies in the West.
