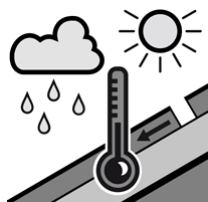

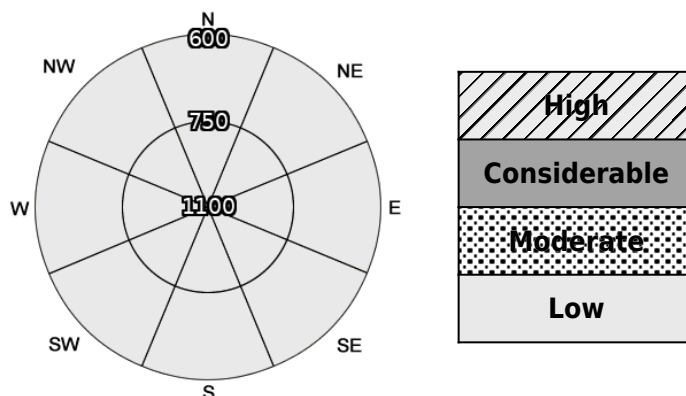

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will remain well bonded on shaded North and North-Easterly aspects as the depleted cover continues to consolidate at all levels. Localised wet snow surface instabilities will persist above 900 metres particularly on steep East and South-East aspects exposed to solar radiation. Any remaining cornice lines above these aspects remain suspect. The avalanche hazard will be Low



Forecast Weather Influences

Little change; high pressure will maintain dry and settled conditions. Freezing levels well above summits, cooler in valley floors due to temperature inversion. Winds will be light to fresh, generally Northerly.

Comments

High pressure persists; although low level cloud hanging around lower and longer.
