
**Avalanche Problems**



**Wet Snow**

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The patchy snowpack will continue to consolidate and will generally be stable at all levels and on all aspects. Some surface wet snow instability possible on the steepest slopes in areas continually exposed to the sun. The snowpack will be much firmer in shaded areas and also around the summits as the freezing level lowers during the day. The avalanche hazard will be Low



**Forecast Weather Influences**

The dry inversion conditions will continue. Low cloud in the morning, becoming broken later with sunny spells as the cloud lifts. It will feel colder as the freezing level descends to around the summits during the day. The wind will be generally Northerly during the day and light throughout.

**Comments**

Classic inversion day; this morning, +2C at sea level and +6C at summit level. Great walking conditions.
