



Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Sunday 20/03/2016

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

During the day, there will be a dusting of fresh snow above 800 metres and localised pockets of fresh windslab will develop in steep sheltered locations mainly on North-East to East aspects. Amounts are not expected to be significant and will be shallow in depth. Elsewhere, the existing snowpack will remain well bonded and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Some drizzle and light rain is expected during the day, falling as light snow above 800 metres. The freezing level will hover around the summits throughout the period. The gusty Westerly wind will be moderate to fresh in strength during the day.

Comments

Cooler today as the inversion cloud lifted to summit levels by midday. Similar tomorrow with some light snow at higher levels.
