



Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised pockets of fresh wet snow will develop in steep sheltered locations mainly on North-East to East aspects above 900 metres. Amounts are expected to be small and shallow in depth. Elsewhere, the existing snowpack will remain patchy, well bonded and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will continue to be relatively mild and cloudy with some patchy light rain and drizzle falling as sleet and light snow on the higher peaks. The wind will be a persistent and fresh Westerly throughout the period with the freezing level around the higher summits during the day.
