

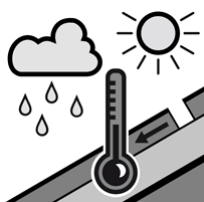

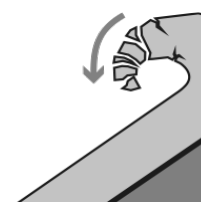

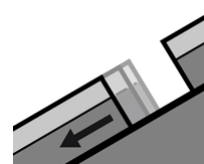
Wind Slab

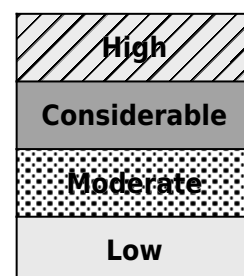
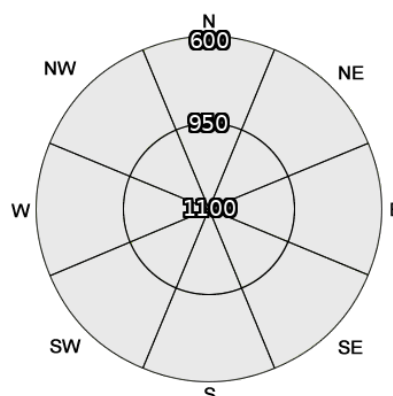

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

A little thin new windslab is possible on East aspects above 1050m. Accumulations expected to be localised and minor in extent. The remainder of the snowpack will remain moist and generally well stabilised. Glide cracks will continue to widen and minor full depth avalanches cannot be ruled out from steep ledges on some crags below 950m. Weak cornices. The avalanche hazard will be Low



Forecast Weather Influences

A trace of new snow overnight then dry. Moderate West winds easing progressively to light West South Westerly during the day. Air temperature hovering either side of freezing.

Comments

Poor visibility above 800m for most of the day, though a little brighter later on Monday.
