






Gliding Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will be stable and consolidated in all areas. Glide cracks indicate snow creep on many steep East aspects. Some new thin accumulations of new snow may form shallow deposits on sheltered East to South-East aspects above 900 metres late afternoon, but these are not expected to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Low



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will be light and variable overnight, then South-Westerly and strengthening to strong West South-Westerly later in the day. A mainly dry day with light precipitation falling as snow showers above 900 metres at the end of the day.
