



Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh areas of unstable windslab will be deposited on mainly North to East aspects above 900 metres. Coire rims and the tops of gullies will be most affected. Although not extensive, these fresh deposits will become increasingly unstable as the temperature rises and the snowpack becomes wet. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight showers will fall as snow above 700 metres. Through the day the freezing level will rise to summit levels before dropping back down to 800 metres at the end of the period. Moderate winds will be from the South-West.

Comments

A change in weather pattern expected to bring a fair bit of rain and snow over the next few days.
