
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Generally the snow pack will remain firm and stable, with new wind slab developing on North through East to South-East aspects above 800 metres especially on high coire rims and wind sheltered aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong West winds will back West-South-West at first. By daybreak the wind will gain in strength to gale force South-Westerly. The freezing level will hover around 700 metres, rising to the tops later. Variable showers are expected, these will fall as moderate snow accumulations above 700 metres.

Comments

Cooling on the summits with some showers expected. Hill paths reasonably clear with some weak snow bridges on higher stream crossings.
