



Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The surface of the old snowpack will become firm in all locations above 800m. Thin moderately bonded windslab expected at the top of steep North-East to East aspects above 900m. New snow accumulations expected to be small and limited in depth and extent. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers dying out overnight then dry but with some further snow showers very late in the day. Winds moderate to strong Westerly becoming stronger South Westerly later. Cold overnight but less so during the day.

Comments

Dreich day on Thursday with very limited visibility above 700m.
