

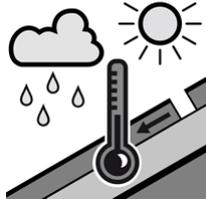





Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New accumulations of poorly bonded windslab will develop on North-West to North-East aspects above 950 metres; here avalanches are likely especially during the rise in temperature. Gullies, steep slopes, and convexities will be particularly affected. Localised unstable windslab will develop on other aspects due to cross loading. New cornices will be unstable. Elsewhere the snowpack will be firm and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Gale force Southerly winds with heavy snowfall overnight above 1000 metres. This will turn to rain with sleet at summit levels through the day as the freezing level rises to around 1200 metres, winds easing to moderate.
