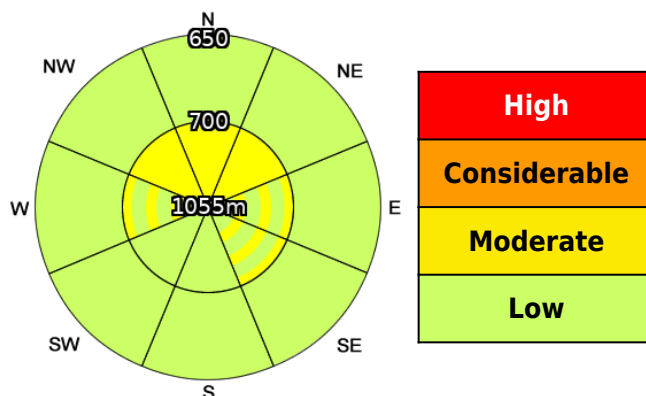

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New areas of wind slab instabilities will form mainly on West through North to South-East aspects above 700 metres. High coire rims and wind sheltered areas will be affected. The older snow pack will become firm and stable as the freezing level lowers. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Fresh North-East winds will veer South-Westerly and then back South-Easterly by tomorrow morning. There will be continued showers throughout the night and in the late afternoon. The freezing level will lower to 500 metres and hover around 500 - 600 metres until the end of the period.

Comments

A cloudy wet day today, showers to continue, falling as snow on higher ground.
