

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

New areas of windslab will develop on West through North to South-East aspects above 800 metres. Mostly affected will be North through East to South-East where the new windslab will build on the older existing snow pack rather than bare terrain, especially on high core rims and gully exits. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Fresh East winds will become light Southerly overnight then veer West-North-West and increase to moderate in strength by the end of the period. There will be intermittent light snow showers with a dry day expected during monday. Freezing level will be 500 to 700 metres.

**Comments**

Obvious snow line at 500 metres. Feeling wintry in the coires.
