

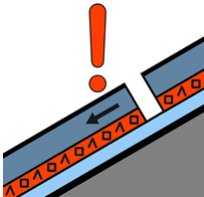

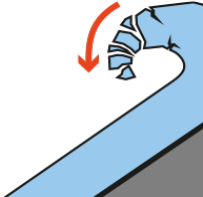

Wind Slab



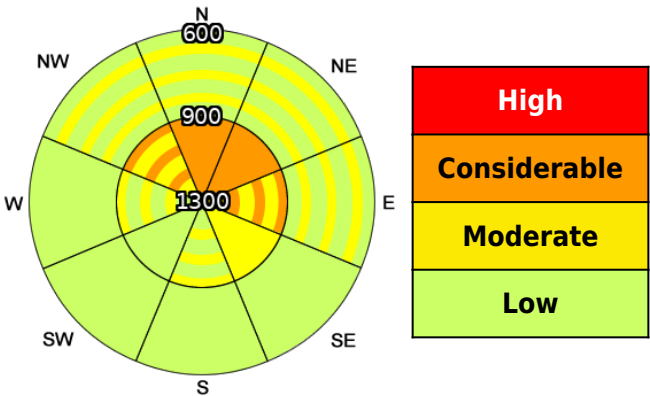
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Initially poorly bonded windslab will continue to develop on North-West to North-East aspects above 900 metres especially in areas of steep sheltered terrain. Through the day there will be some redistribution of snow with new windslab also developing on East to South-East aspects. Localised pockets will form in other areas due to cross loading. Elsewhere the snowpack will be firm and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Light snow showers overnight on moderate Southerly winds. During the day mostly dry with light South-West winds veering North-Westerly and increasing to moderate through the afternoon. The freezing level will be around 800 to 900 metres.

Comments

Old snowpack is re-frozen and very firm with serious run out potential on steep slopes.
