



Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Further accumulations of poorly bonded windslab will continue to develop mainly on North-West through North to East to South-Easterly aspects above 800 metres. Sheltered gully exits and steep corrie headwalls will be particularly affected. Cornices will be fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, some light snow showers above 400 metres with fresh South-Easterly winds. The morning should be predominately dry then snow showers arriving in the afternoon. The winds will ease during the day and become Southerly then veering to West-North-West by the end of the period.

Comments

The snowpack is very firm and icy above 750 metres. Weather conditions should be similar with a showery Westerly air flow persisting and winds decreasing.
