
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Drifting snow will continue to form unstable windslab in isolated wind sheltered places on mostly North through East to South-Easterly aspects above 1000 metres. Places most affected will be where accumulations have achieved depth on steep and convex shaped terrain, gully exits, corrie rims and ridge crest flanks. In all other areas stability will be generally good. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will be moderate strength West-North-Westerly overnight backing Westerly then light South-Westerly by mid afternoon. Light snow showers above 500 metres during the morning and late afternoon. Freezing level 700-800 metres.

Comments

The old snowpack is hard and icy with serious run outs into rocks for trips and falls.
