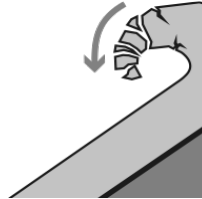

Wind Slab



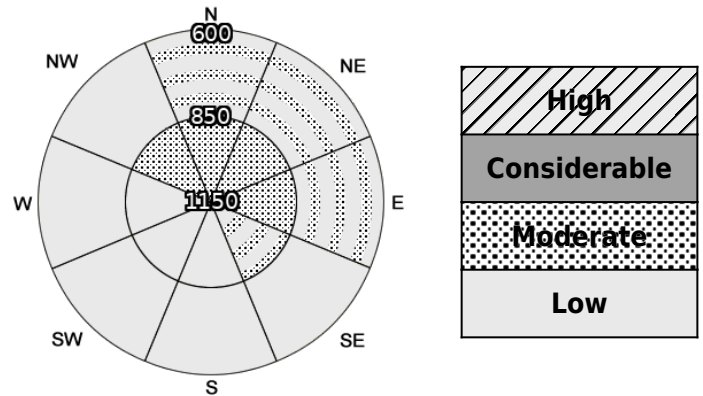
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Further shallow deposits of unstable windslab will form mainly on North to Easterly aspects above 850 metres. The areas most affected will be steep gully exits and corrie rims. Wind exposed areas will be firm and generally stable. Cornices will remain fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Moderate, generally Southerly winds overnight veering and becoming generally Westerly through the day. Light snow showers in the evening becoming dry overnight. Further light snow showers through the day, heaviest in the afternoon. The freezing level will be around 600 metres.

Comments

Drier Thursday but wet and windy at the end of the week.
