



Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 31/03/2016

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will be generally well bonded. On North to Easterly aspects above 800 metres isolated pockets of instability will affect steep convex terrain, corrie rims and gully exits. Elsewhere remaining snow will be stable. Sun exposed slopes will soften during the morning with shaded areas remaining firm underfoot. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Clear and dry overnight, light Easterly winds and a freezing level of around 500 metres. A sunny start to the day as the light winds veer to the South. Occasional snow flurry during the afternoon as winds become South-Westerly and increase in strength with gusts to 35 mph by end of the forecast period. During the day the freezing level will slowly rise to 800 metres by late afternoon.

Comments

Still winter conditions on the tops despite the balmy conditions at sea level.
