

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will be generally well bonded and stable in most places. Some drifting expected leading to localised accumulations of windslab forming mostly around corrie rims and gully tops on North-West to North-East aspects above 950 metres. Instabilities will be mostly within deeper accumulations on steep and convex terrain. Steep sun exposed slopes will be affected by surface instabilities. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Some light snowfall overnight on light to moderate Northerly winds. A mostly sunny day with light Southerly winds strengthening through the afternoon. The freezing level will rise from 500 to 900 metres.
