



Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will be mostly well bonded and stable in most areas. Localised windslab will increasingly build through the day, forming unstable deposits in high wind sheltered locations above 800 metres on mostly North-Westerly to North-Easterly aspects, with corrie rims and ridge crest flanks most affected. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds generally light Southerly overnight gradually strengthening to strong during the day. Freezing level around 800 metres rising to above the summits by the end of the forecast period. Precipitation will fall as sleet or snow above 800 metres throughout the day, turning to rain at all levels later.

Comments

Firm snow with very firm snow-ice on steep shady slopes.
