



Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Through the morning fresh areas of unstable windslab will be deposited on mainly North-West to North-East aspects above 800 metres. Easterly aspects will also be affected by existing deposits of windslab. These deposits will become increasingly unstable as the temperature rises and the snowpack becomes wet. Cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

A wet and windy day is expected. Precipitation will initially fall as snow above about 600 metres, but this rising through the day to around summit level by evening. The freezing level will rise to around 1200 metres during the day. Strong winds will be from the South.
