



Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Stability will decline progressively on North-West through North to North-East aspects above 850m. Most affected areas will be gully exits and the top of steep scarp slopes. Some new weak cornice development expected over steepest lee slopes. Better stability on wind-scoured slopes and exposed ridges. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Dry and cold overnight with moderate South East winds. Snow showers from morning onwards on strong Southerly winds. Freezing level rising from 150m in the morning to 800m by mid afternoon.

Comments

Snow showers expected from daybreak onwards.
